
Ever wished you could go out and be thoroughly entertained? Be carried away on a whirlwind of emotions and come away feeling completely satisfied. Well, you'll laugh, you'll cry and you definitely won't be disappointed when you see *Erogenous Zones*, Spotlight Theatre's sizzling September play.

As the title suggests, this is not a show for the kids, but television shows like *The Sopranos* and *Underbelly* have shown there's plenty of satisfaction in entertainment which involves the seedier side of life.

Not that *Erogenous Zones* deals with murder ... it's all about sex.Relationships beginning ... relationships disintegrating ... relationships which just cling together because those involved don't know what else to do.

Frank Vickery's play is brilliant in its concept because the lives of all five members of the ensemble intertwine, without them even realising. Using brilliant stage craft, the play cleverly takes us backwards and forwards in time to tie the many loose threads of multiple storylines together. The set is designed so the audience can see three different dwellings simultaneously. At times, the cast are in different areas of the set, yet the dialogue in their separate conversations ingeniously ties together as a whole which emphasises one of the play's main themes ... all relationships share common ground.

There are funny moments in the show, but it's no brainless farce. *Erogenous Zones* is a great actor's piece, showcasing the full range of emotions. The cast are finding it immensely challenging and satisfying and the audience will leave feeling likewise.



Underneath the comic façade, the play has some serious issues to point out.

There is plenty in Vickery's script for the audience to identify with: the various stages of relationships that one goes through in life, the uncompromising and unexpected situations we find ourselves in and the different roles we play as spouses, children, friends and lovers. All the characters are clinging onto dead wood in pursuit of happiness, preferring to stay in their comfortable familiar ruts rather than soulsearch — a choice which many people make. The humour centralises on all this domesticity. A play filled with brutal honesty, wonderful comedy and great imagination.

If there's one show you see this year, make sure it's *Erogenous Zones*.





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
