
#### FROM PETE'S DESK

It is always a daunting process choosing material for, and casting, an end of year play for fifty or so young actors who meet for ninety minutes a week in the burgeoning senior primary youth theatre classes here at Spotlight. Numbers can vary considerably from class to

class (generally the later classes on a Saturday are more popular on account of our students' "other commitments" to dance classes, sports competitions and the like). Then there's the problem of the gender balance, drama being very popular with girls who usually outnumber the boys two to one, with the vast majority of roles traditionally being written for males. Finding a play which appeals to contemporary youth

is hard enough; finding one that also satisfies our casting requirements is close to impossible. *Skewl Daze: Revenge of the Emo* is my scripted response to such a challenge. The content was derived from a group devised work with high-school students developed earlier this year, drawing from comic scenes I had written some years earlier and 'given circumstances' for improvised sketches. Rather than going for the realm of fantasy and myth in exotic locations in other eras (standard fare for youth theatre), our kids will be dramatising that place outside the






The school is a-buzz with preparations for the annual end of year

8 formal. Returning to school after a family tragedy, Ashlee is in no mood to talk lip-gloss and hair-straighteners. Annalise, our resident 'emo', has had a gut-full of being bullied by Mikhail and his mate, Nic and has teamed up with the oh-so-nerdy Adam and Jasmine to plot her revenge. Nic takes a shine to Annalise while Danielle gets her tie caught in the photo-copier, a very novel approach is taken to the problem of littering, and to tell any more would be telling too much. *Revenge of the Emo* will be in the Basement Theatre at 7.30pm Fri 27th & Sat 28th November and Sunday 29th November at 2pm. The final classes for all primary aged students is Saturday 6th December.

Life goes on in the youth theatre high school classes as students are put through their paces in a range of 'method acting' exercises. A large influx of new blood, post *Deameo & Juliet*, has been a welcome addition to the course as we head into our last three classes of the year. High School Youth Theatre students will have their last classes for the year on Wednesday 9th December.

I would also like to thank the hard working committee for continuing to go far and beyond the call of duty to make sure that the theatre maintains its high standards and for their support to make my job so much easier.







ost of you will never have seen Kander and Ebb's *CURTAINS*: not surprising as this is the Australian Premiere of the murder mystery musical! Many of you will never have even heard of *CURTAINS*: again not surprising since the murder mystery musical only opened on Broadway in 2006! How exciting to be the very first people in Australia to see this "bright and brassy" murder mystery musical.

By now you will have caught on that this is a murder mystery musical! So not only do you

get to hear the marvellous musical melding of Kander and Ebb (*Cabaret, Chicago, Kiss of the Spider Woman, New York New York*) you also get to work out **WHO DONE IT?** 

Based on the original book and concept by Peter Stone, the musical is a send-up of all backstage murder mystery plots. Set in Boston's Colonial Theatre in 1959, the show opens with the murder of the supremely untalented faded film star Jessica Cranshaw (who can't act, can't sing, and can't dance!) And by show I mean "Robbin' Hood of the Old West".

Confused? Well you won't be when the curtain comes down on this funny, fast paced fantasy. Police detective Lieutenant Frank Cioffi is there to solve the case, and coincidently save the show and maybe even find love, without getting killed himself!

The cast is star studded (not a Jessica Cranford amongst them!) and if the first rehearsals are anything to go by, you are in for a real treat. 

#### **SPOTLIGHT ON 2010**



fter a very successful year, with critical and commercial success, Spotlight forges ahead with another powerhouse season in 2010

First up is *Mr. Cellini's Secret*, in the Basement Theatre. This is another show brought to you by the fertile mind of Kate Tardy. Opening on January 8th, this show is continuing a long tradition. Co-Directing and Choreographing again is Ashley Tardy. The Tardy team that brought us *Monsters Ball*, will no doubt present another entertaining adventure. All-singing, all-dancing musical dolls band together in an effort to outwit their creator, the evil Mr. Cellini, who has been using them to acquire his ill-gotten gains. The dolls create havoc in an effort to bring him to justice with a crazy romp through the real world where his creations come to life – with hilarious results

Next will be the Australian Premiere of Curtains, directed by Tony Alcock along with MD Marie Nicholson, the team that gave us The 25th Annual Putnam Country Spelling Bee. Opening February 12th in the Main Theatre, this is the last show to come from the famous partnership of Kander and Ebb (who wrote such classics as Chicago and Cabaret). This musical is a send-up of backstage murder mystery plots, set in 1959 Boston, Massachusetts and follows the fallout when the supremely untalented star of Robbin' Hood of the Old West is murdered during her opening night curtain call. Can a police detective who moonlights as a musical theatre fan save the show, solve the case, and maybe even find love before the show reopens, without getting killed himself? Curtains will open in February.

The third production for the year is *Play On* opening in the Basement Theatre in April. Directed by Jim Dickson, this production centres on a theatre group trying to put on a play, amid all kinds of interference from the Author. Anything that can go wrong does. Everyone who has ever been a part of community theatre will recognised the trials and tribulations, the missed lines, cues ... its all in *Play On!!* 

May will see the Main Theatre open its doors

to a creature from out of space. The classic *Little Shop of Horrors*, directed by Priscilla Scott. *Little Shop of Horrors* is a rock musical by composer Alan Menken and writer Howard Ashman, about a hapless florist shop worker who raises a plant that feeds on human blood. The musical is based on the low-budget 1960 black comedy film *The Little Shop of Horrors*. From the same team that brought you *The Wedding Singer*, the show will no doubt be a favourite of young and old. A classic piece of musical theatre.

Spotlight's next Production will be *The Boy from Oz*, directed by Rhylee Nowell who brought you *Monty Python's Spamalot*. This famous Australian musical telling the life of Peter Allen, through his songs, will open in the Main Theatre in July. With such classics as *I Go to Rio, I Honestly Love You, The Boy Next Door, When Everything Old is New Again*, and of course with just a touch of sequins and glitter, this show is sure to bring back memories and have you singing along in no time.

To finish off the year, another musical classic, *Crazy For You*. From Director Doug Gehrke and the team that brought you *Chorus Line* and *Kiss Me, Kate*, this classic American Musical is an all-singing and all-dancing hot pot crammed with standards like *I Got Rhythm* and *Embraceable You*. This show tells the story of the adventures of a stage-struck playboy in a Nevada mining town – where romance, mistaken identities, and show-stopping musical numbers all add up to irresistible fun.



#### SPOTLIGHT ON — WHY A ...

This is the second in an occasional series of articles which attempt to explain some of the quaint terminology in use in the wonderful world of theatre.

### Why a Bio-box?

In 1861 Coleman Sellers devised the Kinematoscope—a machine that flashed a series of still photographs producing the illusion of motion. About the same time, Thomas Edison patented a similar device; a Kinetoscope. These were forerunners for projected moving images, and thus cinema itself.

Cine, or cinema, is a contraction of the Anglo-French word 'cinematograph' (circa: 1895~1900, meaning moving picture, and attributed to the Lumiere brothers). Today it refers to movies and movie houses, collectively; and the movie industry, generally.

Nickelodeon film producer W.K.L Dickson was a disenchanted colleague of Thomas Edison. In 1895, he left Edison to form his own company. The new American Mutoscope and Biograph Company was established specifically to develop motion picture projection. Thus, it successfully became the fist cab off the rank in movie viewing. (Today, they still trade as 'Biograph'.)

The name Bio-box is a hang-over from the Biograph film projector.

As there were no purpose-built venues at the time, halls and theatres were converted to show films by erecting small (soundproof) rooms, or boxes, to house the noisy projector; thus the name 'Bio-box'. It could have just as easily become Kine-box or Cine-box (after the competitors to the Biograph film projector).

However, since the advent of rock'n'roll shows being produced at theatres, the lighting operators quickly took advantage of being able to clearly view the performance from the Biobox; instead of doing so from the wings, where they traditionally were. The term 'Bio-box' sort of stuck to designate the control room.

The Bio-box is not suitable for mixing the sound. It is an enclosed environment — shut-off from the audience. For concerts and live theatre, there is no better place for the sound engineer to hear what the audience hears than to be in the auditorium with the audience.


