Auditionees must attend both a dance/movement group audition and an individual vocal audition by appointment.

DANCE AUDITION (1) Basement Theatre 10 am – 11:30am

The Director is seeking both male and female speciality dancers. These dancers will work in the Ensemble but be featured in the production numbers in minor roles. Acrobatic skills will be an advantage. Dancers will need to be dressed in rehearsal attire for the audition with appropriate footwear (no bare feet). The Theatre will be open 30 minutes prior to the audition for registration and warm up.

DANCE AUDITION (2) Basement Theatre 11-30am- 12-30pm

All auditionees who did not attend the first Dance call must attend unless advised otherwise by the production team. You will need to be dressed in rehearsal attire for the audition with appropriate footwear (no bare feet).

VOCAL AUDITION (by appointment)) Basement Theatre from 1-00pm

Auditionees will need to prepare a Disney or Disney-style song and provide a CD backing for same. No sheet music will be accepted. You may be required to do some vocal work with the MD and the Director may also request a cold read from the script.

The Director is seeking a variety of ages, shapes, sizes to create a believable community of characters both in the village and the Beast's castle. There are many small roles that have dialogue and featured vocal spots. All roles are being auditioned.

ROLES

Belle – mezzo

A vibrant, intelligent young beauty who wants more out of life than an ordinary existence.

Beast – *baritone* A Prince transformed into a terrifying beast for his lack of compassion; hottempered and commanding, but with a warm, loving heart buried far beneath his gruff exterior.

Mrs. Potts - mezzo A warm-hearted, maternal enchanted teapot. The cook of the castle.

Lumiere – *baritone* A suave, French, debonair enchanted candelabra. The valet of the castle.

Gaston – *baritone* The story's antagonist. The vain, egotistical, ultra-masculine villain determined to marry Belle.

Maurice – *baritone* Belle's loving, eccentric inventor father.

Babette – *soprano* A saucy, enchanted feather-duster, and the object of Lumiere's affections. The chamber maid of the castle.

Chip – *soprano* (juvenile) An enchanted teacup, and Mrs. Potts' little boy.

Cogsworth – *baritone* A tightly-wound, enchanted stuffy mantle clock and the head of the Beast's household. The butler of the castle.

Madame de la Grande Bouche – *mezzo* A former opera diva turned into an enchanted wardrobe. **Lefou** – *baritone* Gaston's bumbling, toady sidekick.

Monsieur D'Arque – *tenor* The creepy, scheming proprietor of the local insane asylum, the Maison des Lunes.

THE 39 STEPS adapted by Patrick Barlow The Spotlight Theatrical Company, Gold Coast Director: Tony Alcock April 1-16

his adaptation of John Buchan's novel was a far cry from the famous Alfred Hitchcock movie!

The entire cast consisted of four actors who portrayed *ALL* of the characters in the movie in a slick display of acting at its best!

Under Tony Alcock's experienced direction, Matt Hadgraft, Ashley Tardy, David Edwards and Kieton Beilby delivered the most hilarious theatrical experience that the audience had seen for many a year.

They wove their magic on a bare stage with only a few pieces of furniture, a door (used to great effect – over and over), an over-worked window frame and not much more.

As Richard Hannay; the lead character, Matt Hadgraft delivered another outstanding performance. Ashley Tardy was brilliant as Pamela, Margaret and Annabella while David Edwards' comic antics and characterizations brought the house down. New comer, Kieton Beilby, more that held his own in this very experienced cast. This multi-talented young man has a great future as a character actor.

Not only was the pace frantic – changing characters several times in one line of dialogue: but the cast had to speak "in tongues" as their roles required them to be a variety of English and Scottish personnel.

The technical side of the production was flawless with split second timing of most of the cues. Once again, Spotlight presented another great

evening at the theatre.

It was a record breaking meeting timewise, even though we were a quarter of an hour late trying to secure our numbers.

President Duncan Sims, chaired the meeting and most written reports were circulated. Duncan told us briefly about upgrading of Main Theatre Box Office, Bar and Foyer. He also informed us that the Radisson Resort was keen to again offer a sponsorship of Raffle Prizes for our next show *The 39 Steps*. They also did this for *Avenue Q*.

Vice President Ian Peters advised that Spotlight was also looking forward to receiving an updated Quote for W.H. & Safety work required to bring Basement up to regulatory requirements. Committee member, Chris Dickinson is seeking a Grant to help with this although we are hesitant about our chances after the number of catastrophic happenings in Queensland during the past months. Fencing and extra storage is also being looked at.

A number of Security cameras have been installed and we were able to capture clear pictures of thwarted break and enter persons. This is now with the police so hopefully with the new fencing and cameras our theatre will be more secure.

After illness kept her away from the theatre for many months, Chris Harris, our Treasurer presented her report and explained that although some areas were down on profitability (due to the economic climate no doubt) our finances were still holding very well, and our loan had been reduced considerably. Some areas will be investigated by Committee and any problems addressed.

Life Member and Director of Spotlight Golden Girls Pauline Davies has retired and a Vote of Thanks was offered to her for all the work she has done over many years.

Joel Beskin offered a vote of thanks to the Management Committee for the work they have done in the past six months during difficult economic times.

The meeting closed at 7.50pm.




