






The following sets out the substance of the Motions to be considered at the meeting.

1. Proposed Amendment of Constitution

Moved Tony Alcock, Seconded Katrina Lardner that pursuant to s.29(2)(a) of the *Collections Act 1966* the approval of the Chief Executive, Department of Justice & Attorney General be sought to amend the Constitution as follows:

That clauses 5,6,7,8 and 9 of the Constitution be deleted and replaced with

"Membership

- 5. Membership shall be in three classes:
- (a) Adult Membership open to all persons eighteen years and over.
- (b) Junior Membership open to all persons under eighteen years of age.
- (c) Life Membership The title of 'Life Membership' may be awarded by The Company, at the Annual General meeting, to a person who has rendered services to The Company for not less than ten years. Any Member of The Company may submit candidates for Life Membership up to one month prior to the Annual General Meeting. A Committee of three (3) Life Members and four (4) Councillors must vet such nominations. When the Committee is satisfied that all requirements are met, the Council shall award Life Membership to the selected Member who will be notified at the Annual General Meeting. To preserve the dignity of Life Membership, no more than two persons shall be admitted as such, during one financial year.
- 6. (a) Adult Membership shall be given full privileges of Membership, including the right to vote and to stand for an elected office.
- (b) *Junior Membership* shall be entitled to the same privileges, except they are not entitled to vote or stand for any elected office.
- (c) All Members shall pay the prescribed fees, except Life Members, who shall be exempt.

- 7. The Theatre Administration/Box Office shall maintain the register of all Members, for the Council.
- 8. All Members start their financial year on the 1st January and finish on the 31st December of the same year. All Membership fees shall be determined at a General Meeting and shall be due and payable in advance. The Council, at its discretion, may waive Membership fees in special circumstances.
- 9. Any person who is unfinancial shall not be entitled to vote at meetings and shall not hold office. A person shall be deemed financial upon payment of the prescribed fee."

2. Lodge with Department of Justice & Attorney General

In the event that Notice of Motion No 1 is approved then moved Patsy Drew, seconded Tony Alcock that Spotlight Theatrical Company's solicitors, Cronin Shearer Lawyers, be instructed to write to the Chief Executive, Department of Justice & Attorney General, to apply for approval for the proposed amendment detailed in Notice of Motion No.1 above.



ailed as one of the best musicals of all time, *Blood Brothers* has triumphed across the globe. Scooping up no less than four awards for best musical in London and seven Tony Award nominations on Broadway, *Blood Brothers* is simply un-missable and unbeatable. This epic tale of Liverpool life has been running in London's West End, since July 1988 and touring the UK since 1995.

From the writer of *Educating Rita* and *Shirley Valentine*, Willy Russell's powerful and moving drama *Blood Brothers* is making an exciting return to the Spotlight Theatre, Benowa.

Blood Brothers is a rags-to-riches story that makes a haunting musical of our times. Set in Liverpool, it commences in the early 1960's, and spans approximately twenty years.

Mrs Johnstone, deserted by her husband at the age of 25 and with seven hungry mouths to feed, learns she is expecting twins, whom she cannot possibly afford to keep. She cleans house for a childless Mrs Lyons who, learning of Mrs Johnstone's plight, begs one of the twins from her at birth. Mrs Johnstone reluctantly agrees, knowing that the child will be well brought up in a prosperous household.

The two boys grow up streets apart, never learning the truth. They become best friends –





Blood Brothers. They fall in love with the same girl, Linda. A distraught Mrs Lyons convinces her husband that they should move to the country. Soon after, Mrs Johnstone is re-housed to the same neighbourhood and the boys meet again.


In tough financial times, Mickey marries Linda, loses his job, and, enticed by his older brother, Sammy, robs a petrol station, for which he spends time in jail where he becomes dependant on tranquilizers. Linda turns to Edward, now a Councillor, for help. Edward gets Mickey a job and a house. Mrs Lyons tells Mickey that Linda is having an affair with Edward. Mickey, armed with a gun, goes after Edward. He finds Edward at a Council meeting but cannot shoot him — until Mrs Johnstone bursts in and tells them the truth.

The Narrator, intruding like Fate, warns that a "price must be paid". The price is the life of the blood brothers who die — Edward at the hands of Mickey, and Mickey at the hands of the police — fulfilling the prophesy that twins, parted at birth, will die on the day they find out their heritage.


Well' that's all from me; I look forward to another great term as we begin again after the Easter break.

CHAD: Age Range: 25 – 35

Vocal Range: Baritone/Tenor with incredible falsetto

Dance: Movement essential

Character Description: The ultimate ladies man. Think 'Johnny Bravo'. Always shoots from the hip, and is a sucker for a beautiful lady. He is utterly; grotesquely Misogynistic in act 1, and as the show progresses, Chad learns some valuable life lessons that see him grow to love what's on the inside. Must have a Bari/Tenor pop/rock voice and an insatiable presence, great movement skills, guitar ability an advantage. Must remind the audience of Elvis in his early days.

NATALIE HALLER/ED: Age Range: 18 – 25

Vocal Range: Alto/Mezzo Broadway belt with a deep 'man voice'

Dance: Movement essential

Character Description: The true hero of the story, Natalie goes through a massive change and requires an actor who can follow her arc emotionally. Loveable, boyish and devious, Natalie will stop at nothing to get the man of her dreams, including dressing as a man for almost the entire show. Natalie must have excellent comedic timing and a voice to die for. Very plain look, mousy hair, boyish figure, but with a touch of inner vixen shining through. Excellent Alto/Mezzo with a fearless belt and movement skills required. A true leading lady role.

DENNIS: Age Range: 18 – 25

Vocal Range: Baritone/Tenor with a big belt Dance: Movement Essential

Character Description: A nerdy, letterman sweater wearing anti-hero that the audience must fall in love with. Dennis is the unsung hero of the show, whose desperation to win Natalie's heart is as heartwarming as it is pathetic. Dennis' story arc is huge and as such requires a performer with perfect comic timing and the voice of a 50's rock crooner. Must be a person the audience can root for. A shorter stature, very nerdy/weedy looking, good movement

ability and willing to be the butt of every joke. A knight in shining armour that never seems to get the girl.

SYLVIA: Age Range: 35 – 45

Vocal Range: Alto/Mezzo with a showstopping belt

Dance: Movement essential

Character Description: A hard, weathered personality with a voice like a Sherman tank, no one messes with Sylvia. The owner of the town's run-down Honkytonk, Sylvia is a straight shooter who means business and lives for her daughter Lorraine. Superb comic timing and a very dry wit, this performer must have the ability to stop a show with their voice, and is a featured belter in most company numbers. Larger stature, plain looking with a hint of va va voom.

JIM HALLER: Age Range: 35 – 55

Vocal Range: Baritone Dance: Movement essential

Character Description: A sad sack who owns the local garage, Jim lost his wife years ago but has never recovered. The type of character with a permanent rain cloud over his head. Completely oblivious to Sylvia's attempts to admit her feelings for him, Jim goes through a complete change out of desperation. A performer the audience can't help feel sorry for. A shorter stature, hardened and mopey, must have fantastic comic timing.

MISS SANDRA: Age Range: 25 – 45 Vocal Range: Alto/Mezzo with a huge belt Dance: Movement essential

Character Description: The classic romantic with a really wild streak, Miss Sandra really 'Let's herself go' throughout the show, the object of Chad's affections, Sandra must be ample and curvy in all the right places with a whole lot of va va voom. A fearless performer with fantastic comic timing and a voice to die for, she is an outsider in the town with more class in her little finger than anyone she comes across.

LORRAINE: Age Range: 15 – 20 Vocal Range: Alto/Mezzo Belter Dance: Excellent ability required Character Description: A typical hormonally charged teenager in love, Lorraine thinks all love is just like a Shakespearean story. A gorgeous girl, Lorraine works at Sylvia's Honky-Tonk and dreams of the day a handsome stranger will whisk her away. Very pretty young girl required with a sweet belt voice. Excellent dance ability is a must.

DEAN HYDE: Age Range: 15 – 20 Vocal Range: Baritone/ Tenor with some big belt notes

Dance: Excellent ability required

Character Description: A fool in love, the spark between Dean and Lorraine is evident and thus requires excellent chemistry. A very sheltered and naïve character who's only wish is to stay in town to be with the woman he loves, instead of being carted off to Military School by his dastardly mother, the town Mayor. A good looking young man with a sweet voice and a puppy dog face.

MAYOR MATILDA HYDE: Age Range: 40 – 60


