

*The Drowsy Chaperone*, dubbed 'a comedy within a musical' will hit the Spotlight Theatre stage from May 17 with a dynamic cast for the show's Queensland premiere.

The story begins in the living room of the unnamed 'Man in the Chair' - played by Peter Maden - a Broadway fanatic who decides to sure his 'non-specific sadness' by listening to his favourite record, a fictional 1928 musical 'The Drowsy Chaperone' - a gloriously campy romp.

As the characters come into the man's imagination, his living room becomes the stage for the dazzling Broadway set.

The man interacts in and around the characters with hilarious results, interrupting the action to tell anecdotes about the actors and amusing titbits regarding the show.

Actor Peter Maden joked that when Director Clem Halpin asked him to take on the role of the Man, he wasn't sure how to respond.

"The role requires absolutely no singing or dancing talent, so when Clem said it suited me, I wasn't sure whether or not it was a compliment," he joked.

"Having rehearsed with the fabulously talented cast for a few months now, there's no doubt that by sitting at the side of the stage I've become a genuine fan.

"It's my absolute pleasure to have the best seat in the house every night and I hope the audience enjoys it just as much."

Peter perfectly portrays the role with brilliant comic timing and a depth-of-character that ties the whole production together.

The plot of the show-within-a-show centres on Janet Van De Graaff, a showgirl who plans to give up her career to marry Robert Martin to the horror of her producer Feldzieg, played by Jim Price and his investors who have a lot of money riding on Janet's fame.

Janet is played by beautiful Brisbane soprano Charlotte Winter and the groom by emerging

local talent Alex Downey.

Pic by Donn Tantengco Their characters' tale of love and loss is combined in a plot of mistaken identities, dream sequences, spit takes, an unflappable English butler, an absent-minded dowager, a ditzy chorine, a harried best man, and Janet's 'Drowsy' (tipsy) Chaperone, played by the show-stopping local performer Alison McKenzie, who's rousing anthems and over-dramatic interactions make it easy to see why 'The Chaperone' from the play-within-a-play is the Man in the Chair's favourite character.

Alison has played various roles including Anita from *West Side Story*, Diana Morales from *A Chorus Line* and Grizabella from *Cats*.

Accomplished Musical Director David McNeven also stars in the production as Underling, the English Butler alongside the ditsy Mrs Tottendale played by Sandra Harrhy, while Jay Ahrens plays Aldolpho the 'King of Romance.'

The hilarious gangsters are played by Craig Nicholls and Michael Gallegos; Donn Tantengco plays the Best Man George; Sarah Haynes stars as Kitty the aspiring stage performer and Lisa Stanley is the hero aviator 'Trix'.

Director Clem Halpin said the show is full of catchy tunes, hilarious moments, brilliant costumes from Shelly Halpin, Kate Tardy and the wardrobe team, as well as dancing delights choreographed by the highly sought-after Shani McKay.

"We also have a 5.4m wing bi-plane that Austin Reid and the construction team created especially for the show," he said.

"The production is one of the funniest musicals from Broadway and has won five Tony Awards so we are thrilled to be bringing it to Queensland audiences.

"It is a must-see for any theatre lover and the perfect mix of comedy and musical for those visiting the theatre for the first time."



#### THE PHANTOM [Lead]

The Phantom wears the mask and is deformed. He lives in the Paris Opera House, actually, underneath the opera house in the fifth cellar. He is a musical genius who falls in love with the young ingénue Christine. He gives her music lessons in her dressing room through a mirror and by tormenting the diva Carlotta, as well as the rest of the company, he helps Christine get promoted to a lead in the Opera House's productions. The Phantom is dynamic but mesmerizing, sensual but ghostly.

*Actor Age:* 30's-40's

*Vocal Range:* High Baritone or Tenor: Low A-Flat 3 to High A-Flat 5.

Character: Christine is the young ingénue. She starts out as dancer with an amazing voice. She is taught by the Phantom in her dressing room how to sing. She is given the chance to sing and becomes the star of the Opera. When she was a young child she met a young boy named Raoul and when they meet again at the opera they fall in love. Christine is best friends with Meg. Christine is young and highly emotional. Character Age: 20

*Vocal Range:* High Baritone: A-Flat 3 to High A-Flat 5.

#### **CARLOTTA GIUDICELLI [Supporting]**

Character: Carlotta is the resident Opera Diva who had been in leading roles many seasons before Christine came onto the scene. Her job becomes in jeopardy because of Christine's rising stardom. Being the true diva that she is Carlotta quits the production of *Hannibal* after the Phantom nearly hits her with a backdrop. She comes back to hear the managers beg for her to do the production of *Il Muto*. Carlotta is a drama queen who feels threatened by Christine.

*Age:* 30s - 40s

Vocal Range: Soprano (Coloratura): C4 to High E6.

*Character:* Andre is one of two new managers of the Paris Opera. He is more sarcastic and worried about putting on a show. The Phantom to him is just a nuisance and he seems bothered by the drama that happens with Carlotta, Raoul, Christine, and everyone else.

*Age:* 30s – late 40s

*Vocal Range:* Baritone: low A3 to A5.

#### MONSIEUR FIRMIN [Supporting]

Character: Firmin is the other new manager. He is more serious and more worried about money and the business of the opera. He sees the Phantom and all the drama that surrounds the opera house as publicity.

*Age:* 30s – late 40s

Vocal Range: Baritone: low A3 to F5.

Musical Numbers: "Notes I/ Prima Donna", "Masquerade", "Notes II", "Track Down This Murderer".

#### MADAME GIRY [Supporting]

Character: Madame Giry is the ballet mistress for the opera house. She has an awesome cane that she bangs on the ground a lot. Mme. Giry is very mysterious, she delivers notes to various people from the phantom. She is very strict with her daughter Meg. Mme. Giry is wise and knows the ins and outs of the opera and it's residents.

*Age:* 40s – early 50s

*Vocal Range:* Mezzo Soprano: B- Flat 3 to high B-flat 5.

Musical Numbers: "Magical Lasso", "Notes I/ Prima Donna", "Masquerade", "Backstage", "Notes II", "Rehearsal for Don Juan", "Track Down This Murderer".

#### MEG GIRY [Supporting]

*Character:* Meg is the young lead dancer in the corps de ballet. She is Christine's best friend and

it is she who volunteers Christine to sing when Carlotta quits the production. Her mother is the ballet mistress.

*Age:* 20s

Vocal Range: Mezzo Soprano: B- flat 3 to F5. Musical Numbers: "The Dress Rehearsal of Hannibal", "Angel of Music", "Magical Lasso", "Notes I/ Prima Donna", "Performance of Il Muto" [no lines], "Masquerade", "Rehearsal for Don Juan" [no lines], "Don Juan Triumphant", "Track Down This Murderer", "Beyond the Lake" [no lines].

#### **MONSIEUR REYER [Chorus]**

*Character:* M. Reyer is the repetiteur of the Opera Company. His main job is to run the rehearsals despite all divas. He is sarcastic and sort of a tyrant.

*Age:* 40s – Late 50s

*Vocal Range:* Baritone: C4 – F5.

Musical Numbers: "Dress Rehearsal of Hannibal", "A Rehearsal for Don Juan Triumphant".

Company Roles - These roles will be cast from the ensemble.

#### HAIRDRESSER [Cameo]

*Character:* The Hairdresser can be found as one of two Epicine men who gossip about the Countess' affair with Serafimo, during the *Il Muto* performance.

Age: N/A

Vocal Range: Tenor: A4 to F5.

Musical Number: "Performance of Il Muto".

#### JEWELER [Cameo]

*Character:* The Jeweler is the other Epicine man during the *Il Muto* scene. He is accompanied by Meg.

Áge: N/A

Musical Number: "Performance of Il Muto".

#### **AUCTIONEER** [Cameo]

Character: The Auctioneer is exactly what you think he is. He auctions off the pieces of the opera house, including props, posters, and the infamous chandelier. He is actually from the future, 1911, as opposed to when the rest of the story takes place. The Auctioneer is a speaking character with the longest monologue in the show.

*Age:* 40s - 50s

Vocal Range: Speaking part only. Musical Number: "Prologue".

#### MONSIEUR LEFEVRE [Cameo]

*Character:* M. Lefevre is the retiring manager of the Opera House. Even though we know why he decides to retire he is very certain not to mention it to the new managers. He leaves for Frankfurt and has no intention of returning. *Age:* Late 40s- 50s

Vocal Range: Speaking only.

Musical Number: "The Dress Rehearsal of Hannibal".

#### JOSEPH BUQUET [Cameo]

Character: Buquet is your average dirty old stage hand. People think he's nuts because he claims to have seen the Phantom. He sings a song describing how the Phantom looks to the ballet girls and is eventually killed by his hand. *Age:* 40s – 50s

Vocal Range: Tenor: D4 to E5.

Musical Numbers: "Rehearsal for Hannibal", "Magical Lasso".

#### DON ATTILIO [Cameo]

Character: Don Attilio is the Countess's husband during the Il Muto performance

# SPOTLIGHT ON YOUTH THEATRE

#### PETER MORRISSEY - DRAMA

It's great to be back in the classroom again and I heartily welcome the new-comers to Spotlight classes that began over the last couple of weeks. It's never easy joining an already established class but those who did have settled in very well – kudos to all!

I had a few students ask me over the last couple of weeks, how they should go about getting more involved in drama and possibly even working professionally. Spotlight often auditions young actors and advertises regularly for parts in their adult productions. The work mightn't be paying work but it is a great way to work alongside experienced actors and learn our craft while being seen. Most of Australia's great actors started in community theatre before reaching the dizzying heights of their acting careers.

I also get asked about film and television work and particularly about which talent agents are the good ones. Without going out on a limb to plug one agency over another I've always found from personal experience that smaller agencies have worked better for me. I would also avoid agencies that have big sign up fees and try to convince you that you need their photographic services before hitting you up four hundred dollars for a head shot (I've seen great headshots taken on the most humble of cameras!) Remember, they are working for you and you pay them a percentage once you have done the work.

Probably more than any one thing that will sell your film acting abilities is a good show-reel (i.e. a short, professional looking film clip of your film acting work). A good show-reel is likely to give you the edge on other actors that don't have one and is likely to score you plenty of castings. After our annual Youth Theatre productions I run a few film acting work-shops during class time, where students get experience in front of the camera and learn a little about what to expect during a casting.

Also, it's worth registering with QPIX (http://www.qpix.org.au/actor-link/) and occasionally checking Starnow listings (http://filmmakers.com.au/2013/01/starnow/) for films in production that employ actors. Good luck!

Get to as much as you can – a great way to learn how to be a better performer is to see a LOT of theatre!

Hard nosed salesperson Kate, needs an ad written, produced and on-air immediately. Despite the efforts of the Creative Team, the project is thwarted by one disaster after another! Along the journey, the morals and ethics of the characters are corrupted by a combination of money, favours, fear and power. Where does corruption really begin? What compromises to personal integrity do we have to make to be successful and what are the consequences? This witty, contemporary play invites you into a world that really exists. Welcome to a very, very bad day in the office.

You may have heard the authors many alter ego's on Sea FM breakfast shows of years gone by. Talented, local writer, Peter Maden is the creator, writer and voice behind Don Deadline, The Reverend Randy Pecker, Murray Walker, Doctor Felix Frotage, Stewart Gabois and many other characters. Peter Maden has been working in the radio industry for over 25 years. He's currently the Group Creative Director for the multi media giant Southern Cross Austereo which owns over 80 stations across the country including local stations Sea and Gold FM. Peter has won many industry awards for his writing and is five times winner of "Most Talented Male Voice Over Artist" at the Australian Commercial Radio Awards (ACRA's).

#### Character descriptions

*Young Paul:* A teenager 16 - 19 years - Will preferably be tall and thin. "Paul's" son *Paul:* This role is not open to casting call.



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
