Spotlight on Environment

We are taking part in the Cash for Containers Scheme to help the environment and also get some valuable funds for the theatre. Since we joined we have earned almost \$2000 by recycling the cans, bottles and plastic bottles at the local depot. We have our own Scheme ID number C10106788.

How can you help?

Every day you will be using containers that have a 10c refund on them. When you have finished with them instead of throwing them in your waste to end up in landfill why not recycle them and help us.

You can take them to the local depot yourself and, instead of collecting the cash, put our scheme number above into the system and the funds will be directly deposited into our account.

Or you could drop them off at the theatre when you next visit and when we have collected a decent amount, a volunteer takes them to the recycling depot. It doesn't matter if you only have one or two or twenty or more, every one you give to us will nelp your theatre earn valuable coin to help meet the costs of running the complex.


What can you recycle that is refundable?

Spotlight Theatre's second hit musical to be staged this year, **BEAUTIFUL**, is a fantastic production in every sense of the word!

The story follows the life and creative genius of the incredibly talented musician Carol Klein/King.

As CAROL, Gabriella Flowers gives a powerhouse performance with Todd Jesson as her lyric writing husband GERRY GOFFIN, and her friends and song writing rivals CYNTHIA WEIL (Rachel Love) and BARRY MANN (Bryn Jenke). The supporting cast all have their opportunity to present their various "songs" with style.

The score is a catalogue of hits from the 60's and 70's and is brought to life by a wonderful cast under the direction and choreography of multiple Gold Coast Area Theatre Awards winner, Kim Reynolds.

Under the baton of another GCATA winner, Matt Pearson, the 13-piece orchestra is situated in the Basement Theatre next door – a trick that Spotlight have mastered to cope with the Covid restrictions of "2 meter rule" with great success!

The production received a standing ovation on Opening Night and rightly so!

It was interesting to note the precision of the numerous scene changes; all carried out on a dimly lit stage by all the cast and crew under the supervision of Stage Manager, Di Morgan. (A logistical nightmare in less capable hands.)

As has been the case with most of the productions Spotlight has staged since resuming last July, the season was sold out before opening and the additional performances that have been staged with each production have been easily filled from the lengthy "wait list".

And, making this production totally relevant, the Opening Night coincided with **Carol King's induction to the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.**




PRISCILLA is seeking a cast member!

AN EXTRACT FROM "THE STAGE" (LONDON) NEWSLETTER

"Theatre is back and we should feel rightfully elated. Great theatre is made through teamwork, trust, and commitment. The industry came together to get the show back on the road, even if the journey has, and will continue to be a challenging one.

Theatres in England began performances on Monday. The Mousetrap, the longest running play in history was, aptly, the first show to relight the West End, and last night, Les Misérables returned in concert form at the Sondheim Theatre.

However, amid the euphoria, we need to pause and reflect that a lot of our industry will not be coming back to the roles that they had previously held, often for years, due to closures and redundancy. Some may not be able to afford to return to the industry and jobs they loved.

One area where this has been keenly felt is front of house. These staff members are the oil in a theatre's mechanism, keeping it running, though they can sometimes be overlooked. However, as theatres' front-line workers it's their courtesy that leaves the public with a lasting memory of a great night out, and keeps them coming back. As an industry we should always cherish and value this workforce.

Front-of-house workers will play a vital role over the coming weeks, and beyond, as audiences tentatively return. They will help to build a renewed confidence for theatregoing.

For the moment, the experience of theatregoing is going to be different and it's crucial that audience members feel all the effort was worth it and the overall experience surpasses their expectation – especially for those who aren't regular theatre patrons.

Just as seeing The Mousetrap sign on the St Martin's Theatre is familiar and comforting, so too is being welcomed back to a venue by a familiar front-of-house staff member. Frequently these friendly exchanges enhance the evening and leave me looking out for them on future visits.

Connection at every level of theatre is important. Everything links together, and for the audience whose patronage helps pay the theatre and production bills, it is these relationships, no matter how brief, that make a night out.

Front-of-house workers will play a vital role as audiences tentatively return."



WOW! Just WOW!!!


