



CALENDAR GIRLS – A PLAY BY TIM FIRTH DIRECTED BY HELEN MADEN

Agroupofextraordinary women, members of a very ordinary Yorkshire Women's' Institute (WI), persuade one another to pose for calendar charity а with a difference no more photos of 'Wharfedale Bridges". Overcoming their initial reserve, the friends drop their dressing gowns, their modesty only spared bv artfully placed cakes, knitting and flower arrangements.

Puzzling their husbands, mortifying their children and riding the wrath of the outraged WI, they spark a global phenomenon. But as media interest snowballs, the *Calendar Girls* find themselves exposed in ways they'd never expected, revealing more than they'd ever planned. Calendar Girls is quirky, poignant and hilarious.



A play for 6 fabulous 'real' women, each of them appearing in nearly every scene. (Each of the six will appear 'modestly' nude and this should be considered before auditioning). Other roles are smaller and some only a few pages....so if you've ever thought about appearing on stage, this could be where you start! We also need crew, so if you're cast in a small role, you could opt to move set pieces.

Rehearsals will start approximately December 8 through to show time - March 9, with a two-week break; the week before and after Christmas. Show dates: - March 9 to April 2.

Character Descriptions

Chris 50's

The life of the party. She'll find things to say to fill silences, she'll talk to people she doesn't know, she's at home in crowds and loves to be the centre of attention. Has had a long, close friendship with Annie, who would be much better behaved if Chris wasn't in her life!! The two of them together are like naughty schoolgirls. *Ideal holiday? Algarve - Portugal's home to luxurious beach resorts.*

Annie 50's

Will join in mischief but is at heart, more conformist and less confrontational than Chris. After Chris has put someone's back up, Annie will go in and pour calm. The mischief Chris gets them into, saves Annie from being a Saint! She has enough edge to be interesting and enough salt, not to be too sweet. *Ideal car - Reliable! Ideal holiday – walking in English countryside.*

Together, Annie and Chris are greater than the sum of their parts. They would be lesser humans had they not met each other.

Cora, 40's

Cora has an eclectic and troubled past, having gone off to college as a young woman, making a brave break away from her parochial parents. She came back to them pregnant, tattooed and with tail-between-legs, but Cora has too much native resilience to be downtrodden. She's the joker in the pack but never plays the fool. Her wit is deadpan, raising laughter in others but rarely in herself. (Ideally, this person can play basic chords on piano but won't be a deal breaker). *Ideal car - Who cares as long as the sound system is loud! Ideal Holiday - New York.*

Jessie – Late 60/70's

Get on the right side of Jessie 'the teacher' and she'll be the teacher you remember for life. Get on the wrong side and you'll regret every waking hour. A lover of life, she doesn't bother with cosmetics. Her elixir of life is bravery. Her husband of many years is rarely surprised by her actions. Jessie likes to dot her i's and cross her t's. She won't let you get away with incorrect grammar! *Ideal holiday - Walking in Switzerland or Angkor Wat*.

Celia – 35 – 50

Slightly rebellious, Celia is more at home in a glamorous department store than a church hall. She always feels like she's drifted in from another world. Which she has! Would feel right at home on a movie set! (But not in a stereotypical way - keep her real). Celia has a fondness for Jessie, despite the fact Jessie has very little time for the Celia's of the world, but there's a rebelliousness in Celia to which Jessie responds. It's what sets Celia apart from the materialism of her per group and made her defect. *Ideal car – Porsche – which she has!*

Ruth 40 – 50

Ruth takes a journey from false self-confidence of the emotionally abused to the genuine self-confidence of the woman who finds happiness in her own skin. Ruth is eager to please but is not a rag doll. She does have 'spine' – if she was too wet the others wouldn't want her around. But they do, they feel protective of her because they sense there's something better in Ruth than the current life she is living. Ruth needs to transform, from the ugly duckling to the beautiful swan both in looks and confidence. *Ideal car or holiday - At the start, whatever her husband wants. By the end, whatever SHE wants!*

Marie 45- 50 (Appears throughout both acts)

Marie has built the current "Marie" around herself over the years, as a defence mechanism. She went to find her OZ, but her OZ didn't want her, so the WI (Women's Institute) became her trophy, which justifies her entire existence. There's a lingering part of Marie that would just love to be on that calendar. Uptight, efficient! *Ideal holiday? A seemingly academic tour of somewhere in Persia advertised in the Sunday travel supplement, which she could then endlessly bang on about!*

John - 50's Annie's husband (Three scenes) Act one

John is a human sunflower. Not a saint. Not a hero, Just the kind of man you'd want in your car when crossing Australia in a Caravan! When he dies, it feels like the lights have been turned off. His health deteriorates in each of his scenes.

Rod – 50's Chris's husband (Quite a small role - four small scenes) Act one and two

You have to be a certain kind of guy to stick with Chris, but he CAN give back what he gets. He's the type that will take so much and then boil over when the water gets too hot! He has a deadpan humour which has always made Chris laugh and would work every hour to make his flower shop a success. Great mate of John, even though the friendship was originally channelled through their wives.

Lawrence late 20 – 30's Photographer (two scenes) – act one, including "The nude scene"! Hesitant but not nerdy. Lawrence is shy, but with enough wit to make a joke and enough spirit to turn up at the WI. When he arranges the photo-shoot, he's close to female nudity but only sees the 'photo'. He's a gentleman and true professional!

Lady Cravenshire 60 – 70's - (Very small role, Posh English) Scene 3, Act 1 – a few pages, a quick appearance at the very end of in Scene 6 and a short monologue to open Act II. Chairperson of the Royal York shire Golf Club and Women's Institute. She doesn't mean to be so patronising, but the girls of Knapelely seem from another world. The world of her estate staff! She must glide like a galleon!

Brenda 35 – 50 (very small role) four pages, Act 1, Scene 1. Brenda is the most recent of many, who come with dull speeches to the ladies WI meetings... such as the "Fascinating world of Broccoli" or "Bridges of England"! An old fashioned/conservative kind of woman but very proud of her duty to give the women talks.

Elaine 20-30 (possibly Cockney - Very small role - A couple of pages towards the end of the play). An attractive upbeat beautician in a sparkling white uniform. When she comes to make up the women for a television commercial, Elaine hands Ruth her business card, but is oblivious to the fact that Ruth already has one – found under the seat of her husband's car!! Note: Brenda and Elaine could possibly be played by the same person.

Liam late 20-40 (Northern English or possibly cockney – very small role - A few pages in the second act.) He's a television commercial director. He'd rather be shooting something bigger than a commercial for washing powder, but he's not so unprofessional as to show it. We can sense a slight weariness at having to deal with these women. There's a resigned patience to his actions and smile. Slightly egotistical and when he assumes the women will take their clothes off for any occasion, it doesn't go down too well. Note: Lawrence and Liam could possibly be played by the same person.

Term 4 is an extremely busy time for Youth Theatre. Every class will present their End of Year productions over the next 7 weeks.

Commencing with our youngest performers, our Junior Drama classes presented **PEGGY THE PINT-SIZED PIRATE** on October 25 & 26. Following that, our Senior Drama classes will present 2 One-Act plays **CLUE**, and **MOTORMOUTH & SUCKFACE: AN APOCALYPTIC LOVE STORY** on November 8 & 9. Our Middle School Drama classes are next, presenting two Radio Plays: **THE UNDEAD** and **FRANKENSTEIN** on November 15 and 16. 

Spotlight on Environment

We are taking part in the Cash for Containers Scheme to help the environment and also get some valuable funds for the theatre. Since we joined we have earned almost \$2500 by recycling the cans, bottles and plastic bottles at the local depot. We have our own Scheme ID number C10106788.

How can you help?

Every day you will be using containers that have a 10c refund on them. When you have finished with them instead of throwing them in your waste to end up in landfill why not recycle them and help us.

You can take them to the local depot yourself and, instead of collecting the cash, put our scheme number above into the system and the funds will be directly deposited into our account.

you could drop them off at the theatre when you next visit and when we have collected a decent amount, a volunteer takes them to the recycling depot. It doesn't matter if you only have one or two or twenty or more, every one you give to us will bein your theatre earn valuable coin to help meet the costs of running the complex.

> What can-you recycle that is refundable? All beer and pre mix spirit cans and bottles. All soft drink cans and bottles. All plastic drink bottles, water and soft drinks.

No wine bottles please as these are not part of the refund scheme.

(They are recyclable so put them in your yellow top bin.)


